Welcome to Southwick's Zoo!

I will be going to Southwick's Zoo for the day!

Once we park, I will go to the front gate. There may be a line but I will wait with my family or school until it is our turn to enter.

We will need tickets to enter. Tickets can be purchased at the gate or online. Everyone in my group will need a ticket to get into the zoo.

Follow the Rules

- **1.** I will follow the rules to keep me and the animals at the zoo safe.
- 2. I will only walk on the paths, use my quiet voice, and respect the animals.
- 3. I will stay with my family or group while visiting the zoo. If I get separated from my group, I can ask a zoo staff member for help.
- 4. Staff members will be wearing shirts with the Southwick's Zoo logo on them.

Sensory Bags

- If I am feeling overwhelmed I can go to the front gate for a sensory bag.
- Includes: ID badge/sticker, lanyard, noise cancelling headphones, sunglasses, water timer, squishy toy, gripstick, and a copy of the social story booklet.

Please Bee Careful!


Southwick's Zoo is home to many animals and sometimes seasonal visitors make the way here too!

Bee careful as you encounter some of the Yellow Jackets visiting the zoo.

The Yellow Jackets are searching for sweets and meat, anything I can do to reduce their access to food will deter them from bothering me. Some tips for being careful around the bees are:

- Take food outside of its packaging just before you eat it and throw away any unwanted food in a sealed container.
- Keep garbage bags closed.
- Cover glasses or cans when you aren't drinking from them.

Animals



I will see a lot of different animals when I visit the zoo. I can read about the different animals I will see on Southwick's Zoos website.

They will be behind a fence or glass and I can wave and smile to say hello. Some animals may be playing somewhere I can't see them, that's okay and if i want to try again i can come back later.

Some animals may be smelly and some animals may make a lot of noise! If i am ever overwhelmed by an animal, i can move on to the next!

Lions

One of the animals that may make some noise is the lion.

The lions do not roar all the time, but when they do it is to let other animals know that this is their home.

The lion at Southwick's Zoo is LJ. LJ the lion normally roars early in the morning and late in the afternoon when the zoo is closing.



Lemurs



There are 3 Lemur exhibits at the zoo; The Ring Tailed Lemurs, Red Ruffed Lemurs, and Black and White Lemurs.

Just like the Gibbons, our lemurs may be loud when they communicate with each other.

Ring Tailed Lemurs may sound like a high pitch howl. The Red Ruffed Lemur and Black and White Lemur sound more like a loud croaking frog.

The Lemurs are talking to each other by making these noises and will be quiet in a minute or less.

Gibbons/Siamang

Another animal that may be noisy are the Gibbons.

- There are 3 exhibits with Gibbons at the zoo. There are White Handed Gibbons and Siamang.
- The Gibbons do a lot of swinging with their long arms. Gibbons also make whooping noises to communicate.
- They may whoop quietly to each other or loudly to Gibbon exhibits across the zoo. The whooping is like a song they sing together!



Peacocks



Southwick's Zoo has two free roaming Peacocks. They are safe and will not bother me.

The Peacocks do not like to be touched or chased but I can look at them and their beautiful feathers!

Petting Zoo

The Petting Zoo is an area I can touch and feed the goats. While in the petting zoo I will have to follow the rules to keep me and the animals safe!

FUN rules for the petting zoo:

- Be gentle with the goats and don't try to pick them up. They enjoy a gentle pet on the back.

Deer Forest



The deer forest is an area i can feed the deer.

I can feed the deers if i bring quarters and buy corn from the dispenser.

The deer will eat the corn from my palm if I am calm enough. If i am not comfortable with the deer eating from my palm, i can throw the corn on the ground in front of me and watch them eat it!

I should not throw corn at the deer or chase them.

Parakeet Aviary

- The parakeet aviary is a fun place I can go to get a closer look at the parakeets!
- I will follow the rules of the aviary for my safety and the birds.
- **Rules of parakeet aviary**
 - 1. Stay on the walkway
- 2. Walk slowly and calmly
- 3. Please do not touch, grab, or pet the birds. Let them come to you!

If I want to feed the parakeets, I will need cash to buy a feed stick for \$1.



Gift Shops



I may be able to buy something if I have money with me. It is okay if I don't buy anything.

The gift shops may be crowded, if it gets overwhelming I can leave and try to come back at a calmer time.

When it is time to leave the zoo, I will walk with my family or group to the exit gate and to the car.
